DEFENDERS is a three-day seminar sponsored by the AIIA Institute, a Maine-based Christian apologetics ministry, for youth ages 17-24. The seminar is intended to equip college-bound and college students **who are of Christian persuasion** to handle the pressures of non-Christian worldviews and those who promote them, sometimes in an aggressive and hostile manner.

DEFENDERS combines training in basic Christian apologetics with fun and recreation (hiking, kayaking, fishing, moose safaris, etc.) in the northwoods of Maine. All participants automatically also qualify as applicants for a \$500 scholarship, to be used for further training in apologetics.

DEFENDERS is based at AIIA's Study Center in Monson, Maine. Registration is limited to the first twelve qualified individuals to submit a completed application each year. The deadline for registering is May 1, and the event usually begins on the Thursday preceding Memorial Day weekend. Date, times, and other information specific to the year are listed on our web site.

Each participant is responsible for making his/her own arrangements for travel, lodging, and meals — except for one major meal, which AIIA provides. A listing of lodging and meal options near to AIIA is available upon request.

There is no required registration fee for this seminar, but contributions to AIIA are welcome.
